### Courses

**University of Notre Dame, Notre Dame, IN**

**Psychology of Peace (IIPS 30807/60600; MGA 606107; PSY 30634).** This course provides an overview of the field of peace psychology and is focused on how to better understand patterns of violence and nonviolence, identify effective conflict resolution techniques, and promote human dignity. The semester concludes with a unit on interventions that promote positive mental health and peacebuilding. Students must apply and integrate theoretical content in their capstone project.

**Child and Adolescent Psychopathology (PSY 30312).** This course is an introduction to the field of child and adolescent psychopathology. We review the clinical features, diagnosis, and development course of the major disorders of childhood and adolescence. The integration of case studies allows students the opportunity to apply their knowledge and think critically about how various cultural and contextual factors influence symptom presentation, diagnosis and treatment.

**Introduction to Peace Studies (IIPS 30101).** This undergraduate class introduces core theories regarding the nature and causes of violence and peace processes in a global context. The course also includes a community based learning component wherein students must connect theory from the course to local volunteer experience in a series of short papers.

**The Palestinian-Israeli Conflict: Political and Psychological Underpinnings (IIPS 30413; POLS 30327; PSY 30312).** This interdisciplinary team-taught course (with Prof. Patrick Reagan, Political Science) exposes students to the complex issues that underlie one of the world's most intractable conflicts, that between the Palestinians and the Israelis. The course will help students to develop an understanding of this particular conflict as well to develop a vehicle for thinking about other social conflicts. The juxtaposition of political and psychological explanations will provide a multidisciplinary, multi-faceted understanding of the conflict and give students many tools and frameworks with which they can conceptualize their community engagement.
